Minutes of AGM 2021

Minutes from 2021 AGM were accepted as a true record.

Chairs xReport

It's been great to get a full year and almost a full calendar of swimming under our belt. This has not only brought normality back to the club but also some excellent swimming from our membership.

Current financial difficulties are proving a challenge for our pool provider, fees were raised earlier this year as the pool hire fee has risen, we are currently in constant discussion with GLL as to their position with talk of reducing opening hours, closing showers, switching hair driers off and moving certain classes about to save money. As their running costs have risen by 270% since the start of the current financial crisis.

Whilst the club is a fairly good position with leisure centers all over the country closing it is certainly worrying times.

Richard will touch on coaching in a moment, but as I mentioned last year in this report we had a few new poolside helpers, I'm pleased to say that two of these helpers have gone on to gain their level 1 coaching certificate. In addition to this I'm pleased to see the number of officials has increased recently, this is imperative as if we wish to continue to license our club championships, we need licensed officials to fulfill the requirements set by Swim England. A big thank you must be given to all those who have stepped up and given up their spare time to help the club and continue to do so.

The swim camp day we arranged with Aimee Willmot was a success, and I am looking at something similar possibly for this summer, but with more of a focus on coach development, which will inevitably help the membership.

Our goal of returning to normality with the club on as stable a footing as possibly, both financially as well as for the swimmers, mark will touch on finance shortly, but I feel we have succeeded in this.

On the subject of goals in the coming year as a club we will strive to achieve

A to continue to use our 7-week training plan

B to recruit and retain more helpers and coaches and officials

C to arrange a swim camp day to help with our training and squad goals

D Richard will touch on swimmers' goals shortly

E our scoreboard which already mentioned is worse for wear im currently looking at a projector to replace it, but stumbling on the software needed at the moment.

Q. RR: Is there a plan B?

A. Not necessarily just a pool closing issue, there is the single unitary authority to consider instead of our Copeland Council, they may have other thoughts about the number of facilities in the Council area looking at the figures.

Q. JP Should we approach Workington ASC to see if we can get lanes over Christmas if the hours are reduced though the winter

A. Yes, we will consider this if the situation arises.

Q. PE Is there anything lobbied by Swim England?

A. We do not know that level of detail.

Q. KC Would it be better to use the funds from swim camps for a scoreboard?

A. We were able to access funds from Copeland Community Fund so essentially Aimee Wilmott's event cost the club nothing. We do continue to seek funding for projects from various sources.

Q. JD Do we give information on expectations and volunteering to new incoming parents. Could we put something on the noticeboard

A. Yes, we do regular information evenings. Action: JD will take suggestion forward.

Q. MM Can we do more in Learn to Swim to get more children through.

A. Yes with more helpers, this would be possible.

Coaching Report

Richard Quayle gave PowerPoint presentation

Last year was our road to recovery, trying to get back to normal. This year has been building on that progress and getting back to normal competition.



Training

- We are still working to 7x 7 week cycle
 - Although some are longer, some shorter.
 - Our main target is still Nationals
- We now train 6 days a week
 - 8x sessions
 - 5x mornings, 1x Afternoon and 2x Evenings
 - All squads rest on Friday (Recovery is important)
 - Land training is on a Tuesday
- It has evolved from Pre COVID and opening up pools again to where we are now.

- One swimmer qualify for SE Nationals (British or English) 2 achieved

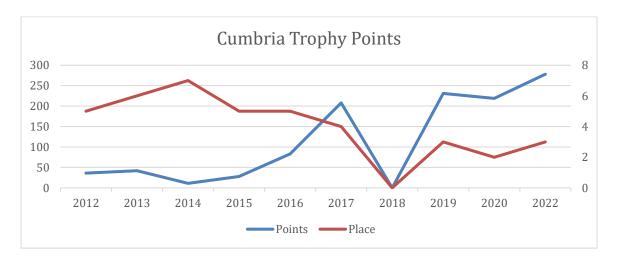

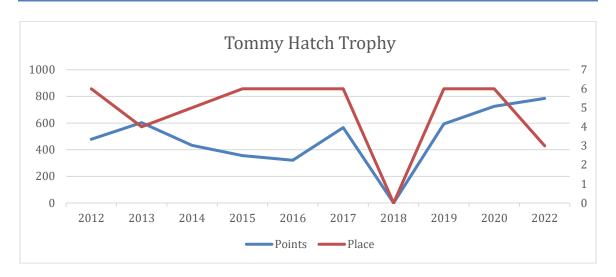

Any Questions?

Q. RR Any level 2 coaching?

A. It's been difficult to persuade people to do level 2 when the courses are at inconvenient times and locations. We've asked the County if they can arrange a level 2 course for clubs in the county and this is progressing. Possibly a level 1 course will be arranged as well. There is increasing pressure from Swim England to have a level 2 coach at every training session.

Q. IR: What objectives for D and C squad swimmers?

A. MH vision for a swimmer sub-committee to consider their input and goals.

A. RQ Mission statement is for every swimmer to achieve their best in swimming so difficult to describe that for an entire club of swimmers. We want to achieve having fun along the way. No individual objectives jotted but its about achieving individual goals for each swimmer.

Q. JD What goals are there for a child who is not getting times for age groups that will keep them engaged?

A. Come and talk to a coach and the coach can then talk with the swimmer. Increased communication.

Q. RR What is the long term plan for the new technology that's being tested?

A. We are in the testing phase and the testing is not going well. Issues for connection times are 7 seconds. Works better for 50m pools where swimmers are above water more.

Club continues to be in a stable financial position but have larger outgoings than income.

Pool fees are still in excess of subscriptions with a large risk that rising energy costs may impact pool costs or have a larger risk of facility closure.

Membership costs increased part way through the year so full effect to be seen but membership has fallen due to small number of leavers.

Financial outturn excludes a £2,200 Gift aid claim and c.£1,000 from the Keswick to Barrow. Further Gift aid claims in the coming months including 2021/22.

Resuming home galas has aided the financial position.

Slide 4

Members have continued to support the club in charitable fundraising but this would benefit from a targeted approach and dedicated committee.

Club should aim for a group of parents from across the squads to collaboratively target fund raising options including gala income.

We need to identify a basket of measures to address the issue ranging from membership levels, sponsorship, social events, grants, fee review and ultimately reducing pool time. Succession planning is key, the next generation of committee members and club leaders need to be identified.

Slide 5 – Recommendations

Adopt the accounts as an accurate record

Hold membership fees until the new calendar year and review position

Continue as a charity and identify a 'charity of the year'

Develop a fundraising committee and empower them.

Consider succession planning in the coming year for key roles including Treasurer.

Q. Sponsorship or support?

A. As long as we don't enter into a commercial agreement with a company we can seek and accept support from them.

Q. KC. What has Arena league cost this year.

A. Entry into Arena is £200. The bus was about £200 for each Kendal trip. Nearly £800 for the bus to go to Ellesmere. We are investigating costs on this.
